

Allen, J. Duncan Fodder supplier

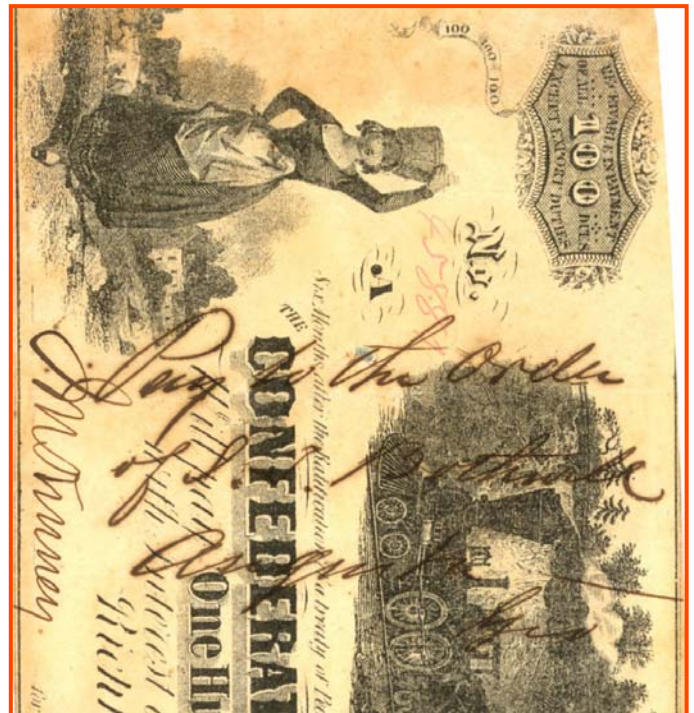
Eighteen documents are found in a file for J. Duncan Allen in the National Archives files for Citizens. All but one of the documents exhibit signatures which are a good match to the Treasury note endorsement, suggesting that this file contains at least one document of a different man (the spurious signature is not in the clerical hand of the voucher). The endorsement on the Treasury note is unusual, and reads: "Pay to the order of J. T. Bothwell, Augusta, Geo." Fourteen documents exist for Jas. T. Bothwell, nearly all of which record the place as Augusta, Georgia, including interest payments to Bothwell by T. S. Metcalf, Depository at Augusta, for a total of \$5,900.00 worth of interest-bearing notes; the serial number of the illustrated Treasury note was not among them.

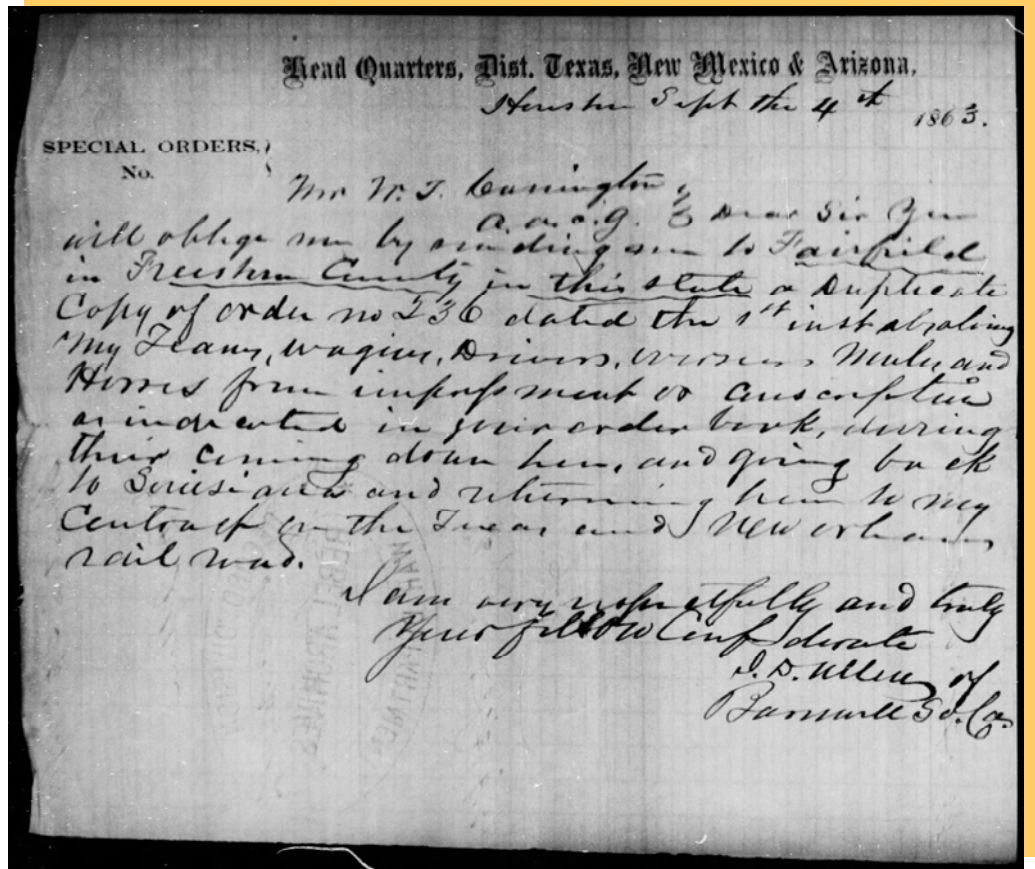
On October 24th, 1860, at Barnwell, South Carolina, J. D. Allen wrote a long letter to the governor expressing his views on criminal activity and religious matters. A voucher dated March 31st, 1862, listed a "feed cutter" for \$40.00 sold to Capt. Watkins L. Wickham, AQM, at Bowling Green, Kentucky. Allen sold fifty thousand pounds of fodder to the post quartermaster (illegible) on April 1st, 1863, at Alexandria, Louisiana for the sum of \$1,250.00.

A very unusual letter to Mr. W. T. Carrington, dated September 4th, 1863, at Houston, Texas, is written on a military form for Special Orders of the Head Quarters, District of Texas, New Mexico & Arizona, in which he complained of impressment of his "Teams, wagons, drivers, ...mules, and horses...." The last document, dated December 21st, 1863, recorded the impressment of a horse at Barnwell, South Carolina, by Capt. G. H. Kirkland, Impressment Officer, for which Allen was paid \$500.00.
